Dear colleagues, dear members of the GMP,

With the worst of the covid period at our back and after two years of virtual F2F due to the pandemic, the GMP board was finally able to meet in presence on June the 3<sup>rd</sup> of June in Montpellier and to approve the objectives for the next 12 months. We are quite excited to move forward in the ambitious program the GMP has planned for the period 2022/23, with the most important 2022 event being of course the joint congress coorganized in partnership with the colleagues of the DMDG and the SPS associations which will be indeed held in October 2022 in Amsterdam.

The scientific program the joint scientific committee is putting in place seems outstanding. I let you discover more about it in the dedicated section of this newsletter.

A big thanks is no doubt owed to the many sponsors that are sustaining the event with their donations. We are honestly surprised by the interest this event has generated and the positive feedback already received both from our historic sponsors and from the additional companies willing to contribute to the success of our scientific event.

Two additional workshops are being organized this year. The first one was held on July 6<sup>th</sup> at Espaces Diderot (Paris) in collaboration with SOLVO, Cyprotex and Simulations Plus, covering integrated in silico/in vitro QSP approaches to Drug Induced Liver Injury (DILI) prediction. The second workshop will be on December 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> in Marseille and will focus on PBPK. This event, co-organized with the heads of Master 2 in pharmacokinetics and Phinc, is still under development, but some detailed anticipations may be already shared with you in the dedicated section of this newsletter.

Another important event for 2022/23 is the complete renewal of the GMP website!!! Indeed, not just its appearance was a bit outdated, but also the engine managing the services provided to our adherents via the web required important updates and it was too limited for the other purposes the GMP board would like to implement in the next future. In particular, we are aiming at facilitating access to our events and to additional initiatives/contents including collaborations and partnerships with other academic organizations and additional services dedicated to adherents and to students. In occasion of this ambitious rethinking of the quality and quantity of the contents proposed by the GMP on the website, the GMP board has decided to fully dedicate one of its members to the direct management of our website. ### « Transporter « Workshop

With great applause from good participation, GMP conducted its one-day workshop on "Transporter mediated toxicity prediction with integrated in-vitro/in-silico approach using DILIsym" jointly presented by Solvo Biotechnology, Cyprotex, and Simulations Plus on the 6th of July 2022 at Espaces Diderot, Paris.



We were proud to have speakers from USA, Hungry, and UK. The theme of the workshop was "how in vitro and in silico methods can combine to understand liver toxicity based on liver transporter"?


**Solvo biotech** provides deep insight into the Introduction of Transporter assays for testing BSEP, MRP3-4, NTCP, and MDR3, and how to obtain *in vitro* data for *in silico* modeling. Speaker from **Cyprotex** explained about utilizing *in vitro* mechanistic assays in DILI risk assessment. Later, the speaker from **Simulations Plus** provided a demo about how these in vitro data can be integrated with QSP modeling by DILIsym and quantitative analysis of mechanisms in DILIsym.

A total of 11 people participated in the workshop from diverse backgrounds such as in vitro experimental scientists, the Pharma industry, and Contract Research Organization (CRO). We received very positive feedback from the participants where they liked the content of the workshop and greetings with the words "excellent presentations, high quality, very impactful. The presenters were also excellent". These feedbacks encouraged us to do more workshops in this domain.

# Organization of a workshop PBPK in Marseille on December 8-9, 2022

On the initiative of the Society **Phinc** and thank to their participation, this workshop will welcome industry people and students of the French master 2 in pharmacokinetics willing to get advanced knowledge and to practice in PBPK.



During the first day (also available in visio for the students who could not move), several talks will be given in the preclinical (**Donato Teutonico**, Sanofi), clinical (**Letizia Carrara**, Servier and **Marc Codaccioni**, Certara) et toxicological fields (**Pierre-André Billat** or **Céline Brochot**, Ineris).

The 2<sup>nde</sup> day will be dedicated to building and use of PBPK models under the supervision of two animators, **Jérémy Perrier** (Phinc) and **Florence Gattacceca (Université Aix-Marseille).** 

On April 8, the GMP has organized its second student webinar devoted to the pharmacokinetic professions.





Through 5 talks of 15 minutes each, 5 professionals allowed participants to discover different professions in the pharmaceutical industry, in health agency (Anses), and at the university:

- Pharmacokinetics and pharmacology in clinical development (I. Deprez, Certara)
- Pharmacokinetic(/pharmacodynamic) modeling in clinical development (N. Djebli, Roche)
- Far from the lab, close to science: science communication professions in the pharmaceutical industry (N. Szili, Solvo)
- The profession of pharmacologue expert at l'Anses-ANMV (AM. Jacques, ANSES)
- Pharmacokinetic modeling at the university: training and careers (F. Gattacceca, Aix-Marseille Université)

At the end of the presentations, students had the opportunity for 20 minutes to ask questions to stakeholders via the chat, in particular on the different modeling approaches, the career developments, and training and PhD. It was the place for a nice exchange.

This webinar turned out to be a real success with over 60 participants, both students (Master 1 & 2, PhD students / 88% from Pharmacy, 12% from science faculties) and teachers. We received a lot of very positive feedback about this webinar, and we are very happy that it was able to meet expectations (88% of survey responders found it very useful). Preclinical pharmacokinetic development and pharmacometrics are topics that participants would like to develop at an upcoming event).
